Administrative Council Meeting Minutes - April 25, 2024

Present: Kevin Armstrong, Becky Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Cindy Deavers, Wanda Harding, Beth Howdyshell, Linda Howdyshell, Laura Jenner, Corey Johnson, Bill Lalla, Pastor Mike, Bruce Rogers, Karen Whitmer and Sandy Wyrick.

The meeting was called to order by chairperson Becky Breeding, and Bill Lalla read a devotion from the Upper Room.

Finance: (Kevin Armstrong reported)

- The 2023 audit has been completed.
- We will pay \$2,080 for apportionments. Then we will work on sending money for the Active and Retired Clergy incrementally.
- The signs are up for the tenderloin meal. An ad will be in the Staunton Daily News Leader on Friday. And then it will be on WHSV TV next week.

<u>Treasurer</u>: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- Balance Sheet / Local Missions Fund we made \$1600 on peanut butter easter eggs, and we made \$147 made on the chocolate easter suckers ~ both of those amounts have been deposited.
- Dividends of \$1803.31 are in the money market. Cindy Deavers made a motion to place this as a partial payment to Weekday Religious Education. It was seconded by Wanda and the motion was passed.
- The remaining amount will come from the local missions fund, the motion passed.

Pastor Mike: (Pastor Mike reported)

- Mike and Susan will be moving from the parsonage on June 18th. They officially vacate the parsonage on June 26th.
- Pastor Mike's last day preaching is June 23rd
- Now until late June, we will be shoring up volunteers the Nominations Committee and the Staff
 Parish Relations Committee need people to help get things ready for Pastor HK.
- On Sunday, May 19th we will recognize our graduates.

Staff Parish Relations Committee: (Sandy Wyrick reported)

- The search for a new permanent pianist is still ongoing. One person expressed interest, but is not in this area yet.

Trustees: (Corey Johnson reported)

- We had a parsonage inspection on April 15th. Pastor HK walked through the parsonage on April 19th, and he is requesting the duct to be cleaned. The stove may need to be replaced. Some furniture may need to be removed and stored. Painting needs to be completed.
- The plan for the old oak tree in the front of the church is to be stump grind and add a new one.
- A handle has been replaced at the back door.

United Methodist Women: (Wanda Harding reported)

- The Circle of Love and the Circle of Hope meet on Monday, May 6th at 6:30pm.
- The Sisters of Faith meet on Monday, May 6th at 1:30pm

Lay Leader: (Bill Lalla reported)

- We are averaging 55 people each Sunday for worship.

United Methodist Men: (Bill Lalla reported)

- The Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper and Easter Morning Breakfast went well.
- The workday at Mr. Cull's was fine and the UMM received an extremely generous donations. And we are awaiting a start date for another fundraiser workday at Mr. Cull's residence.
- A church workday is coming soon to address the outside of the property, including weeding, pruning, mulching, etc.
- Several of the men assisted in taking down the old oak tree in the front of the church.
- The UMM have examined the church basement and have started plans for cleaning and organizing that area. This will include donating unused items for the Ruritan's yard sales and

cleaning and reorganizing the other items. The fridges downstairs were also unplugged.

- The UMM will finalize their budget for 2024 at their May meeting.

Unfinished Business:

- The schedule of events is updated now on the calendar by the front door.
- There has been alot of cleanup and things have been organized. The cabinets in the hall, the library and the upstairs rooms have been organized, and cleaned up any food.
- The downstairs closets have been checked for craft supplies. *Please use these items before we buy new items.* Bruce stated that "if it is here, use it", "if we run out, we will replace it."
- Props need to be moved out of the storage room of the nursery and moved downstairs.

New Business:

- The next meeting will be May 23rd, which will be a meeting focused on Finance, followed by Programming and Event Planning, starting at 6:30pm.

Pastor Mike dismissed us with a prayer. The meeting went from 6:30pm-7:23pm


Kermit sang it best in his signature song... "I'm green and it'll do fine. It's beautiful, and I think it's what I want to be."
