Church Council Meeting Minutes - March 25, 2021

Present: Dallas VanLear, Cindy Sheets, Kevin Armstrong, Karen Whitmer, Wanda Harding, Pastor Mike, Bruce Rogers, Robin Craun and Nathan Kutz.

The meeting was called to order by chairman Dallas VanLear, with devotions and prayer read by Cindy Sheets.

The minutes from the February meeting were accepted as distributed.

Finance Report & Treasurer's Report: (Kevin Armstrong)

- ~ Thanked Wanda Harding and Karen Whitmer for their continued efforts in counting the tithes and offerings.
- ~ Corey Johnson will perform our planned internal audit.
- ~ For the last month, Giving has been down from previous months.
- ~ It was recommended that we make our normal payment for apportionments for the month of March.
- ~ Nothing outstanding in the Treasurer's report this month, activities are minimal right now heating is winding down, etc.

Trustees: (Pastor Mike)

~ John Morse made a list of projects for the Trustees to work on in the coming months.

Pastor's Report: (Pastor Mike)

- ~ In the last month, the Technical Assistance Manual for local churches to use as a guide for returning to in-person worship has been updated 3 times. The main change is that on April 1st, 2021; we can have 50 people gathering inside for non-worship activities, with continued social-distancing. We can also have envelopes put back in the pews, but no pens or pencils.
- ~ For Holy Week, it has been decided that we will not serve Holy Communion, hopefully in the summer we can partake in that sacred activity again.
- ~ We will not have a Maundy Thursday Service this year. We will have a Good Friday Service on Friday, April 2nd at 7:00pm. And on Sunday, April 4th, we will have a Sunrise Service at 7:00am. It will be outdoors for about 30 minutes. We will be able to sing, but we will not have breakfast afterwards. We will also have our Easter Worship Celebration on April 4th starting at 10:30am.

Spiritual Nurture:

~ On Saturday, March 27th at 9:00am, they will be putting together Easter Egg bags for the children of the church and local community. The bags will have candy, eggs and activities in them.

Evangelism: (Pastor Mike)

~ Pastor Mike announced that Nathan Kutz and Cheryl S. Bennett will take over as co-chairs of the Evangelism Ministry.

United Methodist Men: (Bruce Rogers)

- ~ The UMM have decided on their budget.
- ~ They discussed some fundraising projects, but nothing is firm at the moment. They may work with the UM Women for some future fundraising projects this year.

United Methodist Women: (Wanda Harding)

- ~ Thank you to everyone for their support of the Emma's Ride project. The family will be receiving their new van next week.
- ~ The Circle of Hope met on March 1st, with 8 people present. They had a program with the theme of Hope and Denial. They also worked on filling easter eggs for the kids' easter bags. Their next meeting is Monday, April 5th at 7:00pm.

- ~ The Circle of Love met on March 9th, with 9 people present. They had a program with the theme of Hope and Denial. They also worked on filling easter eggs for the kids' easter bags. They prepared Easter cards to be delivered to residents in local nursing homes as a way of saying that people care about them and are praying for them. Their next meeting is April 13th at 7:00pm.
- ~ On Saturday. April 24th, there will be breakfast for the homeless at Basic UMC in Waynesboro. This will be a serve and go style breakfast, therefore no one will be able to stay and eat on the premises due to Covid-19 precautions. If you are interested in helping please contact Wanda Harding or Jennifer Strother.
- ~ May 16th will be United Methodist Women Sunday and will be celebrated with a guest speaker.
- ~ The UM Women and the UM Men are in talks to work together for some future fundraising projects. They are currently in talks to possibly do a tenderloin dinner in June and split the proceeds for both of their respective mission projects.

Membership: (Karen Whitmer)

- ~ Morene Morris passed away on Tuesday, March 23, 2021.
- ~ There is some concern about how to reach out to people who have not been back to church since the Covid-19 pandemic shut everything down last year. There was some discussion about how we can reconnect with those people and how we reach out to them and let them know what's been going on; especially those who are not active on social media. Pastor Mike may send out a personal letter to those people.

Lay Leader:

"Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit." The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it? 



The story is almost done, but Jesus had one more person to see. His name was Thomas, and he was one of the disciples that wasn't there when Jesus met with them. Thomas had also heard that Jesus was alive, but would not believe until he saw Jesus with his own eyes.

A week later when Thomas finally saw Jesus, Jesus said to him, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Stop doubting and believe." But Jesus continued, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; but it is more amazing for those who don't see me, and believe anyway."

It's really neat, but Jesus was actually talking to us when He said this. If you believe in Him, without seeing Him, He will think you're very special! That is exactly what faith is: believing in God even though you can't see Him.
