There was once a man who lost everything. He was a farmer and lost all his livestock. He had many children, and he lost them as well. He even lost what good health he had left. He lost everything. Despite all these losses, despite all these hardships, this man had the most unique, faith-filled response I've ever heard. He said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return there; the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21)This man, Job, did lose a lot. At the same time, though, Job rested his life in the hands of God trusting God to carry him through it all.

I doubt most of us would respond the same way Job did. Maybe we would, maybe at certain times we could, but I must admit, it may be challenging for us to say "blessed be the name of the Lord" when we are facing serious challenges. That may not be our natural response, but it could be. In the face of loss, disease, and death, what comfort will we find in fury, or anger, or pain? Wouldn't it be much better to rest ourselves in the hands of God?

What Job went through always strikes me. Few of us will ever suffer such complete losses like Job did, although some of us will face similar situations. The question for us though is this, "How will you react when those times do come?" We could allow our grief in this world to swallow us alive, sapping our love for others, sucking out our will to live, crumbling our desires to even enjoy life. Thanks to Christ, though, the opposite could occur. Instead of folding inward upon ourselves and our grief, we could fall back into the arms of our loving God, the Creator of the heavens and the earth, and the redeemer of all creation.

There is a hymn entitled "Be Still, My Soul" (UMH 534) which does an excellent job guiding us into those loving arms of our God. When faced with loss, with physical pain and with death, the hymnist says this in the first verse:

Be still, my soul: the Lord is on your side. Bear patiently the cross of grief or pain; Leave to your God to order and provide; In every change God faithful will remain. Be still, my soul; your best, your heavenly Friend Through thorny ways leads to a joyful end.

Pains in this life will come. That is an unfortunate promise. The question, though, is this, "Where will you go when those pains come?" Thanks be to God we have a loving Savior in Jesus Christ who invites us to come to Him.

The meeting was called to order by chairman Dallas VanLear, with devotions and prayer read by Samantha Brensinger.

The minutes from the June meeting were accepted as distributed.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong)

~ PRG (Post-Covid Re-entry Group) met last night. Holy Communion will continue as we did it on July 4th.

New Business:





Full Surrender To Jesus Christ

"This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us." 1 John 1:5-10 ESV

This thought has really been weighing on me here recently. Last month was about pride and humility, and since I wrote that I have been contemplating pride a lot. I believe that pride is one of our foremost enemies and honestly is our Trojan horse. I'm not saying anything new here, I know we all need a level of pride. But when pride leads to the elevation of us over God and his plan even unknowingly with the best of intentions, our own setbacks by our own hand are coming. I have lived this and as the old saying goes I've eaten my share of crow. It all really sounds elementary like "Ok thanks, I'll start being more humble now!" If only it were that simple, it turns out the act of honestly giving life over to Jesus Christ is one of the hardest things that most people will ever do. Maybe they honestly one day actually did, but you know sometime later (from my personal journey) they put more faith in their personal pride of life than the origin and Creator of all things. This is about full surrender to Jesus Christ, who I am convinced is alive and well and who did more for us than we honestly can ever fully comprehend in this life.

The passage above I think gives a perfect picture to Christians today and unbelievers also. We can't walk in darkness and be holding to God's unchanging hand. If we really choose to walk with him in his eternal light, the blood of Jesus cleanses us. Until then we aren't clean, and saying that we have no sin (which can only come from a position of pride) we make him a liar, and his word can't do us any good if it isn't in us. I encourage you to read Proverbs 16:5-7. When we get rid of arrogance and pride, we are no longer against God, and when we truly please God he even says that our enemies will become peaceful. If you're reading this as an unbeliever in Christ, I ask you to lay down pride and come to him. He doesn't guarantee an easy path, but if you take up your cross and follow him, he has made promises to his own that really are more beautiful than you will ever get or reach in

this life on your own. There has never been a promise he has made that anyone has seen to be false. He is fair and just to not only the good people, but also the bad. His faithfulness endures forever. It takes a lot for us as believers to swallow our pride, but according to the words we claim to read, believe, and hopefully say, humility in us and pride and bragging in Jesus Christ our savior is truly the only way forward.

We want to attach a poem I was inspired to write a few days ago. I hope it is an encouragement to you and gives you the view of God that I saw when I wrote it. May God bless you and like us on Facebook and Instagram at Real Life Heavenly Hands. We are here to encourage and support you in your walk with God.

Who has found the deepest depth of God? Or who has found the paths which Angels trod. Is there enough time to count up his footsteps, or find out how he has built our place of rest. I think it's impossible to truly praise his name, or too really comprehend the love with which he washed away our stains! My friend, may you understand that he is the ancient of days. And before you were, it was your soul upon which he gazed. How can we even imagine turning away, for when we turn around it's his creation we see night and day. His fingerprints are all you will see, and time to count them all will never be. Please heed his call, and on your prideful knees finally fall. To struggle on your own in this life is futile at best, one day you will be done with putting God to the test. At your own cost it will be, and you will have no choice but to see.
