Administrative Council Meeting Minutes - August 22, 2024

Those in attendance: Pastor HK Kim, Becky Breeding, Sandy Wyrick, Corey Johnson, Alicia Copeland, Cindy Deavers, Bill Lalla, Karen Whitmer, Wanda Harding, Linda Howdyshell, Beth Howdyshell, Laura Jenner, Susan Mehler

Becky Breeding called meeting to order, Sandy Wyrick offered devotions, Pastor Kim led us in prayer

Minutes from the July meeting reviewed, no additions, correction, approved by all.

Finance: (report from Bruce Rogers)

- Church offerings are being received steadily, 2025 budget is still under review to be presented upon its completion

<u>Treasurer</u>: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- All bills are being paid and payroll being met. No issues.

Staff Parish Relations: (Sandy Wyrick reported)

- No report, all is well with staff.

<u>Trustees</u>: (report from Corey Johnson)

- Propane tank removed from parsonage. During the big dig the internet cable was cut in half, church has no internet at this point, awaiting Comcast to respond for repairs. This issue led to a discussion/suggestion to move from Comcast to New Hope Telephone Coop for the high-speed internet service as possible alternative; an investigation is needed to determine when the Comcast contract would end apparently auto renews via a credit card number on file Corey will check with Pastor Mike to get clarification on the internet/ billing process.
- The dehumidifier in the basement had been cleaned and now is properly working. Discussion about carpet cleaning, confirmed the church budget has set funds aside to have carpet cleaned 2x a year.
- Discussion/confirmation the \$1767.00 is being paid to the UM conference for active /retired clergy health fund, as required

United Methodist Women: (Wanda Harding reported)

- Both Ladies circles have had meetings in August and are planning September meetings.

District Conference Delegate: (Wanda Harding and Bill Lalla reported)

She advised there are 3 important events which the Methodist Conference strongly suggests "we" attend. Usually, the attendees of the meetings are to be the Pastor and his assistant. However, Pastor Kim will be out for his paternity leave, which led to a discussion – suggested the materials which need to be reviewed/signed be received electronically, from the conference -and sent back to conference electronically – also this process would avoid the long trip to /from the places the meetings are to be held. Someone will ask if an electronic process could replace/avoid an actual meeting. Meeting deadlines are as follows:

- 2. 10/24/2024- Thursday DEADLINE for District Charge Paperwork to be submitted
- 3. 11/03/2024 Sunday District Conf & Charge Conference meeting Skyline High School to approve the paperwork submitted/ vote on budget

Lay Leader / United Methodist Men: (Bill Lalla reported)

- 1. Church service attendance is balancing out to 55 people per Sunday, hopeful to see increases now school year has started.
- 2. United Methodist Men have meeting slated for September
- 3. Bill advised he completed research in the area of other churches/community groups on how they are doing with Oyster suppers and such. Others are struggling with events due to the pricing of oysters. UMM have decided to table the HOTS dinner again this year. Oysters are at an astronomical price per gallon, and we do not have the "manpower" to undertake a HOTS supper as known in years past. Understandably the community would love for New Hope UMC to host another HOTS, as would we because we make the best fried Oysters. He suggested we keep building upon the small fundraisers we have like the Friday Night dinners; they work well, less people and with surprising success. All those in attendance agreed with the same.

Membership: (Karen Whitmer reported)

- We lost Joanie Troxell Schofield Joanie passed away on 07/27/2024. She became a member of New Hope UMC 03/31/ 2013, Pastor at the time was Doug Gunsalus.
- Betty Lou Selmon passed away on 08/03/2024- She joined New Hope UMC on 06/08/1986, Pastor at the time was Glen Evans
- Karen also advised she is working on updating/auditing the current membership roll. It is believed apportionments we pay to the UM Conference are not based on the total number of members/ names listed in the membership roll, apportionments are based on a budget we send to the conference. Pastor Kim has reached out to the conference to confirm the same and will get back to council with clarification/ hopefully something in writing. Also, the UM book of Discipline lists several provisions to assist with this process.

David's strength came from his deep faith




