From Pastor Mike

A few thoughts to share as the year ends:

I am thankful for your resilience and faithfulness in the face of these challenging circumstances. COVID-19 infections are on the rise in Augusta County, yet we continue to engage in ministry in a safe and responsible way. We have been creative. We have been stretched beyond our comfort.

In November we had 14 people participate in our "Reckless Love" Bible study. (Yes, it is possible to have an in-person Bible study with face coverings and social distancing.) We distributed ham rolls and Advent devotionals and raised \$1,000 for the local food pantry. The UMW Circle of Love held its first meeting in November. The UMM met and elected new officers for 2021. We may be fatigued but we still push ahead.

This month we will have a four-week Advent study beginning Wednesday, December 2. I have a few books available if you are interested. The Local Expressions craft group is planning an event to raise money for outreach.

Advent and Christmas will push us to try different approaches to worship and ministry. Thanks to everyone who helped decorate the sanctuary for Advent. We had to do it in stages this year – perhaps, not as much fun and having a large group come together, but we did it. Our thanks to Martha Fretwell, Wanda Harding, Kim Maugans, Susan Mehler, Bruce Rogers, Joetta Walker, and the Riner and Powell families for their help with decorating. And thanks to Wendy McLaren who made the beautiful wreaths. If I have missed anyone, I apologize.

For Worship during the Advent and Christmas seasons, our theme will be "Company's Coming." Advent It is a season of excitement and anticipation and joy. We may not be ready for what is coming. And yet, in this season, there is joy. And we have a sense that we can start all over again, because "Company Is Coming."

The 2021 calendar is here and features different photographs each month as we look at special moments from the past few years. We have 100 calendars available. Make sure you get a copy for your home.

We cannot sing Christmas carols in the sanctuary. That is hard. I know we miss singing very much. So, we will try something different this year. Each Sunday after the benediction, we will gather in the parking lot to sing a favorite carol. It may be cold outside, but those carols will warm our hearts. For those of you watching from home, I am not sure we will be able to include this in our livestream.

Christmas Eve will be different this year. After consulting with the Worship Committee, the Healthy Church Team, and other area United Methodist Churches, I have decided not to have an in-person Christmas Eve service. Instead, we will work with four other local churches (Barren Ridge COB, Laurel Hill Baptist, Middle River COB, and Mt. Horeb Presbyterian) to record a service of Lessons and Carols to share online. More details to come as this service comes together.

As we enter into Advent and journey to the manger together, I pray that your heart will be filled with the joy of this season as we join our hearts in worship and prayer.
