From Pastor Mike

I went with Susan to her parent's house in Maryland on Sunday, January 24 to help get the house ready to sell. My job was to help get her mom's Ford Taurus running so it could be sold. So, I spent Monday morning installing a new battery; by 1:00pm I was finished and proud of my little accomplishment.

Just before 2:00pm I received a voicemail from my oldest brother, Mitchell. The message was: "Hey Mike, give me a call when you get this message." Given the time of day, I knew it was probably not good news. I called my brother back and he said two words, "Dad died."

I heard my brother's words clearly, but they were hard to process. I knew dad would not live forever but sometimes it seemed like he would.

You see, my dad survived 2 open heart surgeries, 2 gall bladder operations, and a double knee replacement since the summer of 2012. Each time he recovered and was able to resume the tasks that meant so much to him: caring for his yard, planting a garden, and doing other home maintenance tasks. I often joked that he was like a cat with nine lives but at 1:25pm on Monday, January 25, 2021, my father, Harry Reaves, took his last breath on this earth.

I am thankful for the 88 years God gave my father in this world. We had a nice visit with him and his wife, Helen, a few days before Christmas. He was in a great mood and he told lots of stories about growing up on his parent's tobacco and dairy farm in Halifax County, VA.

I am grateful that I have had both of my parents with me for more than 59 years. I will miss visiting with Dad and talking about his garden, the Boston Red Sox, and UVA football and basketball. I will miss that big grin he always had on his face when we walked in the door of his house for a visit. That only touches the surface of what his death means to me.

Losing a parent is never easy but I take comfort in God's loving embrace. I know we will be reunited one day in the eternal kingdom. Until then, my father will remain with me in the memories I carry and the lessons I learned from him.

Thank you for all your kind cards, texts, and emails since his passing. Susan and I also appreciate the beautiful potted plant that was brought to the parsonage and all other expressions of sympathy.

The following are the minutes from the JANUARY meeting of the Church Council. The minutes are available for you to help the entire church family Stay In The Know about how this group is caring for New Hope UMC!

Church Council Meeting Minutes - January 28 2021

Present: Dallas VanLear, Cindy Sheets, Kevin Armstrong, Karen Whitmer, Wanda Harding, Cindy Deavers, Robin Craun, Mitch & Samantha Brensinger, Bruce Rogers and Nathan Kutz...

The meeting was called to order by chairman Dallas VanLear, with devotions and prayer.

The minutes from the December meeting were accepted as distributed.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong)

- ~ Thanked Wanda and Karen for their continuing efforts to count the tithes and offerings each week.
- ~ There is sometimes a problem with Wanda getting a bank receipt from Dupont CCU when she goes to deposit the money because her name is not on the account. Therefore, Bruce will draw up a letter that she can give to Dupont, so that she will have written permission to receive information for the church's bank account.
- ~ In 2020, we spent 83.5% of the budget. And we took in 82% of what we had projected. Which means that we spent \$6,000 more last year than we took in.
- ~ Currently payroll is \$8,100 per month, plus \$2,639 for apportionments per month. So, we need \$10,753 each month; not counting what we need to pay utilities and some other bills. Therefore, if we are not taking in at least \$2,688 per week; then there starts to become some concern.

~ We will need to conduct our annual audit, the problem is: Kevin A, Cindy D., Robin, Karen W., and Wanda can't do the internal audit because they handle the money/finances on a regular basis; and Becky Tate can't do it because of coronavirus concerns. So, we need to brainstorm who we can ask to do this for us internally this year - who is able, willing and qualified? We need the audit done by April 1st.

Treasurer's Report: (Cindy Deavers)

- ~ As of today, we have 2 weeks of giving that is counted and deposited, but not in the books yet. So, we will have an additional \$7,398 that is not showing in the books yet.
- ~ The church has received our restitution check of \$250 from the young man who wrecked and destroyed our church sign.
- ~ New apportionments statements came in for 2021.
 - In 2020, we paid 51.25% in apportionments to the District and the Conference. In 2020, we paid \$15,457 in total to the Conference for Priority 1 apportionments and we paid \$4,044 in total apportionments to the District.
 - For 2021, we are scheduled to pay \$2,639 each month in total apportionments to the district and the conference: \$1,918 to the Conference Priority 1; \$305 to the District, and \$416 to the Conference Priority 2 apportionments per month.
 - Kevin suggested we paid the whole \$2,639 for January 2021 and then we re-evaluate each month to see how much we will pay each month. It was agreed by all to proceed in this way.

United Methodist Men Report: (Bruce Rogers)

- ~ At their last meeting the UMM had 8 members present, the most since February 2020.
- ~ In their last meeting the UMM discussed what they can do in 2021, even with limited funding.
- ~ They have between \$6,000-\$7,000 to work with towards local missions. They are considering maybe partnering with the UMW or others to achieve the most impact.
- ~ They will work try to develop some additional funding options if possible
- ~ On February 13th, the UMM will help with the Spaghetti Fundraiser, they will donate \$200 towards the efforts and supply volunteers to help that day.

United Methodist Women Report: (Wanda Harding)

- ~ Thanked Dallas and the UMM for their help last year in partnering with local missions and fundraisers.
- ~ The church was very generous last year in missions.
 - 900 million Christmas Boxes were sent out in December 2020.
 - People have been very generous to the Emma's Ride Project, and all of those involved would like to thank everyone for their generosity.
- ~ On February 13th from 4-6pm there will be a Pick-up Spaghetti Dinner at the church. All donations will go towards Emma's Ride.
- ~ Valentine's cards will be collected at the church to go to local nursing home residents.

Spiritual Nurture: (Samantha Brensinger)

- ~ Martha has emailed activities to the kids for Valentine's Day fun at home. And Jennifer is knitting hearts for them.
- ~ There is discussion to send out Easter Egg Bags to the kids again this year.
- ~ Vacation Bible School 2021 options will be discussed further.

New Business:


- ~ Robin has mailed out all of the giving statements. If you don't receive yours soon, please contact her.
- ~ Cindy D. made a motion to send \$100 from the church to St. Jude's in memory of Pastor Mike's dad. Flowers will also be sent to the family.
- ~ Dallas thanked everyone for coming to the meeting in the cold and for all of their hard work.


Lots of Letters

Christian, Be Quiet! - By: Joe Chase

I don't know that I have ever heard a sermon on the need for quiet. Yet, the Bible teaches that God will "quiet you by his love" (Zeph. 3:17). Peter lauds the need for a quiet spirit, which is very precious in God's sight" (1 Peter 3:4). Habakkuk instructs all people "...the Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him." (Hab. 2:20)

We need to stop talking so we can listen. We need to turn off the screens so we can meditate on God. We need to shut off the radio, CD player, iPod and turn down the noise of life so we can truly hear God's word.

Being quiet helps us to concentrate on what needs to change in our hearts, minds and lives. So often the voices of worldly passion, selfishness, lust, fear, hatred are present within us. We have skillfully ignored them so long that they blend in with noise of life. As Christians, we can silence those worldly callings as we put off the old man and put on the new.

T.O. Chisholm penned these beautiful words that teach just what I'm trying to say:

Buried with Christ, my blessed Redeemer, Dead to the old life of folly and sin; Satan may call, the world may entreat me, There is no voice that answers within. Dead to the world, to voices that call me, Living anew, obedient but free; Dead to the joys that once did enthrall me— Yet 'tis not I, Christ liveth in me.



Quiet forces us to listen to our inner man as he calls us to reform our character. Many of us don't hear our own soul's cry to seek God's saving grace. We've turned up the distraction volume knob squelch the pains of guilt and remorse and the cry for repentance.

Why are we so afraid to hear the call of our own broken lives? Some try to drown out the quiet with booze or drugs. Some try to hush the Word of God from working on their conscience by filling every moment with some noisy distraction, foolishly thinking; "if I don't hear it I won't have to deal with it."

Habakkuk knew that focusing on the Holiness of the Lord takes a halting of everything else. That is why he calls for silence in God's temple. I wonder if we remember that we are God's temple. God should occupy the throne room of our hearts. This calls for our lives to be sober and reverent reflections of the Heavenly Host reigning in our hearts.

Another need for being quiet is that we should be more careful what we say. We really don't have to insert our opinion into every conversation. We don't need to try to say everything we think. In fact, we would be much better off if we were "quick to hear, slow to speak" (James 1:19).

Being quiet includes refraining from gossiping, slandering, bragging, boasting, vainly flattering, lying, swearing, cursing, talebearing, criticizing, speaking words of contention, coarse jesting, idle words, and euphemisms etc..

Imagine how much quieter we would be if all this speech was removed from our conversations.


