Meeting Minutes

- Meeting was called to order by President Mitchell Brensinger. There were 5 members present.
- MINUTES:
 - o No minutes were presented from the previous meeting.
- OLD BUSINESS:
 - o Temperature pressure relief valve from the hot water heater was repaired by Darryl.
 - o Parsonage bathroom door hinge was repaired by Corey.
- NEW BUSINESS:
 - o Request received from the United Methodist Men for potential summer work projects was discussed. The following projects were identified
 - Painting of Social Hall walls and back door area
 - Cleaning of the Social Hall windows
 - Parsonage porch area to be cleaned and painted
 - Clean up of the front sign and surrounding area
 - Trim branches from trees. Specific focus on the adjacent parking lot. Concerns of the youths program (50's Diner) were expressed as vintage cars will park in the area. Discussion on how to address the higher branches was headed by Darryl.
 - Graveyard work. Apply grass killer around headstones.

- Discussions on Air Conditioning the Pastor's office in the Sanctuary was conducted. Pastor stated that there is no hurry on project completion. Darryl and Lewis had project recommendations. Research into the projects will be conducted.
- Discussion on the flooring and subflooring of the Social Hall was addressed. With post pandemic activities resuming within the next year, concerns of potential damage from wood destroying insects were the primary concern. Noticeable bowing seems to be occurring in the Social Hall. Mitch volunteered to conduct a thorough inspection, and agreed to have an assistant with him for safety reasons. If wood seems damaged or weakened trustees were in agreement to have a professional inspection conducted.
- Discussion on the "Cross and Flame" on the front of the building was addressed.
 Particularly, for the lighting of the sign for better visualization and promotion of the church at night. The front parking lot sign lighting was also mentioned for electrical work. Work on the "Cross and Flame" would require cleaning, wire mesh installation to keep the birds out, and electrical re-connection. Subject tabled for future meeting.
- Lawn contract was discussed. The trustees are satisfied with the work of the new contractor. Minor issue with grass clippings on flat headstones was addressed by Lewis but stated that it is "not a big issue" as far as the overall work completed. Group suggested having church groups address downed limb removal on the property to help the lawn technician perform his work. Corey will pass word to the contactor of the overall consensus of the trustees.
- Meeting was closed by President Mitchell Brensinger. Next meeting will be held on July 14th at 6:30 PM and thereafter return to the traditional 2 month schedule previously observed. Adjourning prayer was conducted by Pastor Michael Reaves

The minutes from the May meeting were accepted as distributed.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong reported)

- We have enough money for our bills for this money and for our agreed upon apportionments.
- The treasurer's report for May is up-to-date, the one for June is not currently up-to-date.
- Our balance is staying about the same, and we have nothing outstanding.
- We have paid out \$65,000 of our \$186,000 budget so far this year.
- All chairpersons need their 2023 budgets into Kevin by August 1st.

- A Confirmation Class is planned for the Fall.

Spiritual Nurture: (report from Samantha Brensinger)

- The potato bar fundraiser was a success and almost \$2,000 was raised to help Sandy Wyrick and family with the expenses from her surgery.
- Vacation Bible School is just over a month away and we still need volunteers and supplies.
 I want to thank everyone who has volunteered already, Alicia (Music), Chrissy (food), and Austine (preschool). The youth group is also supporting VBS by running the Recreation Station. There are registration forms in the church and a link on facebook for kids to get signed up for VBS. Also, for the VBS picnic on the 31s,t we want to hand out school supplies like we did last year and will have a list of needed school supplies up soon for donations.

United Methodist Men: (Bruce Rogers reported)

- No meeting in June.
- Please see the UMM minutes from their May meeting in the church newsletter.

Lay Leader: (Jennifer Strother reported)

- The next Laity training will be in August, it will have both in-person and remote options.
- We have received alot of religious books from Basic UMC. Jennifer is in hopes of reinstating some type of church library to house those books and others. Will possibly look at the old Wesley Sunday School classroom to be a possible new location for that, and some think it may be a good compliment to the adjoining History Room.

Communications: (Cindy Sheets reported)

- Cindy Sheets stated that the Valley Bikers for Veterans requested that our church participate again this year and be a rest stop for the bikers riding through the valley to raise money for a local veteran's charity. This event will be Saturday, September 10th. Dallas made a motion to support this event, Kevin seconded it and it was passed by all to support this event.
- Cindy Sheets stated that the organizers of the Fall Foliage Bike through the Valley have also requested that we be a rest stop for their event on Saturday, October 15th. If we participate in this event, they will give us up to \$700 for our time and effort, and they provide the drinks and snacks. We will just man the rest stop and hand out the supplies as the bikers come through. Kevin made a motion that the youth work this event, in an effort to get them more money for their fundraising efforts. Jennifer seconded it and it was passed by all.

Dallas Van Lear ended the meeting by thanking us for coming out and appreciating all we do. Kevin sent us off with prayer, and the meeting ended at 7:02pm.

Confirmation Class at New Hope UMC Coming September 2022

Be Confirmed in your Faith

Confirmation is a program for students in grades 6 -12 who wish to be confirmed in the United Methodist Church. The program is designed to study the beliefs of the United Methodist Church as well as to dive deep into what it means to be a Christian. Upon completion, students will have the opportunity to stand before the congregation and proclaim their faith and their commitment to New Hope UMC.

What does Confirmation look like?

At New Hope UMC, confirmands will meet once a week from September through November for 8 weeks. We will meet on Sunday mornings during Sunday School. The class is taught by Pastor Mike to help the students understand and grasp the key elements of their faith as Christians, as well as basic United Methodist theology.

When is Confirmation?

Confirmation will begin on Sunday, September 10, 2022, with a meeting of all confirmation students and their families after worship. Our first class will be held on Sunday, September 17 during the Sunday School hour. Confirmation Sunday will be November 19th, 2022.

What is Confirmation?

Although confirmation is not a sacrament in The United Methodist Church, it is an important marker along our spiritual journeys. At baptism, we are initiated into the new covenant in Jesus Christ and membership in the Church, Christ's body in the world. For many, this happens when they are very young.

We recognize children are members of their families, but no one expects them to clean their rooms or empty the dishwasher until much later. In the same way, "baptized infants are members of the Church—the family of faith—but are not yet capable of sharing everything involved in membership."

Confirmation is an opportunity to respond to the grace of God available to us, as acknowledged in baptism, and to promise to live as a person of faith. "What God offers us must be accepted in repentance and faith...confirmation and reaffirmation are our responses of commitment, a profession of faith, and rededication."

Parents should encourage their children to register for Confirmation Class. Registration forms will be available at the information table in the Narthex. The deadline to register is August 28, 2022.

"... For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11)

This is a familiar passage of Scripture where Christians can take comfort in knowing that God has a plan for our lives regardless of our current situation. Also, Jeremiah 29:11 points out that God can work through any hardship to prosper and give us hope as believers.

Bishop Sharma D. Lewis, in recognizing the uncertainty surrounding issues of LGBTQ inclusion in The United Methodist Church, the challenges of a global pandemic, and a further postponed General Conference, wanted to focus on the future of churches in the Virginia Conference by forming Team Jeremiah.

The goal of this group is to meet monthly to discuss proactive strategies and effects on the Virginia Annual Conference in light of a postponed General Conference. The group began meeting monthly in January 2022.

Team Jeremiah is composed of a total of 15 theologically and ethnically diverse clergy and laity within the annual conference. In addition, there are three resource members who will resource on an as-needed basis.

You are invited to a conference-wide Q&A session on topics including General Conference and disaffiliation from the denomination on Tuesday, July 12 at 7 p.m.

The July 12 Q&A session will be held through Zoom webinar. All questions need to be submitted in advance so the team can organize questions by topic. Questions will be accepted until the close of business on July 11.



Kids' Corner - Armor of God

In biblical times soldiers would wear very heavy armor. In fact, when David went to fight the giant Goliath he couldn't wear the armor because it was too heavy. These days, soldiers don't wear armor, but you might find it interesting to know that Christians many wear everyday and it armor would be a good idea if you did too.

How can you wear armor? This armor is so neat; it's like having special powers that are invisible! When you imagine yourself putting on the armor of God each day it will help you against the devil as well as the things you shouldn't do. However, the only way this armor will work is if Jesus lives inside you.

The devil wants us to mess up and do things God doesn't want us to do. He might try to do that by getting you interested in violent video games, shows on TV or movies that show people doing

things that are sinful and try to make them look like fun. You might also be pressured by other kids to do things that we know God wouldn't want us to do.

These are some of the ways that the devil tries to trick you into doing things you shouldn't (this is called sin). By putting on the armor of God, you will be able to stand up to these things and do what is right. The armor will give you God's help to fight against the bad in the world.

We are going to start with the **Belt of Truth**. We need to put this on first to be truthful and remember the truth we know about God. We can know the truth by reading the Bible, the Spirit telling us (giving us a conscience), or learning from other people who believe in God the same as us.

Next is the **Breastplate of Righteousness**. If you play hockey you probably have something that protects the part between your neck and tummy. This piece also protects your heart. We can protect our heart by confessing any sin we have, or saying sorry to God for things we've done wrong.

Now we put on the **Sandals of Peace**. First, we need to protect our feet and go where God would want us to go. Our feet would get sore if we walked around with no shoes on, so we need to avoid places we know we shouldn't go to keep our protective sandals on. Second, we need to be peaceful with others. If there is someone you're fighting with or if you've hurt someone's feelings you need to go ask for their forgiveness, or forgive those who have wronged you. Third, if you find things are a little hectic God is the peacemaker, and if you ask He can give you all the peace you need.

The next piece of armor you don't have to wear; instead, you hold it. It's the **Shield of Faith**. Just think of what you could do with a real shield. If someone throws a snowball at you, you can lift the shield so it doesn't hit you at all. We can use the shield in the same way when bad things come our way like temptations or doubt.

Sometimes the devil will try to make us think that there isn't a God, or that he doesn't love us because we've done something wrong. We need to hold up our shield and stop these thoughts when this happens and remember that God loves us no matter what.

The **Helmet of Salvation** is the next piece. This is what we use to protect our minds. Sometimes we need to remember that we're God's children and He loves us and will help us. We also need to remember what we've read in the Bible and learned from our parents and church about God. That will help us make the right decisions.


The next piece of armor that we hold is the **Sword of the Spirit**. The sword is both the Bible and having the Spirit of God work in us. We can cut anything off that isn't good in our lives. By remembering God's word (the Bible) we will be able to tell what is good and what is bad.

Prayer is the last piece of armor. This isn't a particular piece of armor but kind of holds all our armor together. By talking to God we can do amazing things. Nothing is too big or impossible with prayer because God can do anything that He wants to. That doesn't mean that he will always answer the way we want him to, but he will answer the way He knows is best.

When we pray, we need to remember that we don't always need to ask for things. God also wants us to pray for others (for people that don't know Him, for people we don't like, for people that are sick, etc.). He also wants us to thank Him for whatever we are thankful for (being good at something, family, friends, toys, etc.) He blesses us with these things so we should thank Him.

A good way to help you remember the armor is to put it on each day when you get out of bed or before you go to school.

Pray that God will help you remember that the armor is there and what it's used for so you can fight the bad with the good.



But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. - Hebrews 3:13 NIV
