### Church Council Meeting Minutes - August 25, 2022

Present: Andy Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Cindy Deavers, Pastor Mike, Cindy Sheets, Jennifer Strother, Dallas Van Lear, and Karen Whitmer.

The meeting was called to order by chairperson Dallas Van Lear. And Cindy Deavers read devotions from "Jesus First" from John 13:15.

The minutes from the July meeting were accepted as distributed.

### Finance Report: (report from Kevin Armstrong)

- We can make our normal abbreviated apportionment payment for this month.
- The 2023 budget has been assembled with the exception of the apportionment section. If you have any late request please forward them to Kevin asap, they will need to be approved at the September Council meeting.

### Treasurer's Report: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- All giving has been recorded as of this date.
- Payroll will still need to be done and there are sufficient funds to make the monthly apportionment payment.

### **Trustees:** (Pastor Mike reported)

- There will be a meeting on Tuesday, September 13th.

### Pastor's Report: (Pastor Mike reported)

- Planning to have 2-4 students in Confirmation Classes this year. September 11th will be an orientation lunch after worship. Sunday, November 20th will be Confirmation Sunday.
- Thursday, September 29th will be the Nominations Committee Meeting
- Charge Conference will be Sunday, November 6th @ 3pm.

### Worship: (Pastor Mike reported)

- All Saint's Day will be November 6th
- Veteran's Day will be November 13th, and The Dunns will also be here to perform on this day.
- Pastor Mike will be working to set up the Worship Committee again for next year.

### **United Methodist Men:** (Dallas Van Lear reported)

- The UMM served the VBS picnic.
- They will have their next meeting on September 15th
- There will also be a church-wide clean up day on September 10th.

### **United Methodist Women:** (report from Wanda Harding)

- The UMW met on Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. The members agreed to become an inactive unit with the new South River District UMW & Virginia Conference UMW. We will continue with our commitments for the remainder of fiscal year that ends on September 30, 2022. All contributions need to be sent to Pat Ewers by August 28<sup>th</sup>.

### **Communications:** (Cindy Sheets reported)

- Jeff Hite is looking into getting our TV Monitor in the Nursery working properly again.
- The copier in the office has had a small piece broken off of it and we need to call SVOE to have it looked at and fixed.
- Pastor Mike stated that he was able to print a test page on the black printer in the church office. He and Cindy S. will get together to see if a page can be printed successfully from the computer.
- Cindy Deavers stated that the printer used by the finance committee is not working properly. It seems not to be connected to the finance computer. We will look into this as well.
- 50's Drive-In is on track as well as it can be.

### New Business:

- Alicia requested that on Sunday, October 29th, that we use that day to restart our 5th Sunday Luncheons. Dallas and Mike suggested that we explore that possibility. Pastor Mike suggested that we move this to Sunday, November 13th when The Dunns will be here.

- Cindy Deavers raised the concern about leaders of the church. That maybe we should have some type of training event or retreat to help them understand what is expected of them. Jennifer suggested that maybe we have an anointing ceremony during church one Sunday, to acknowledge these people and bless these leaders.
- Cindy Sheets stated that she will once again make a list of officers and committee members for 2023, for anyone who wants to pick up a copy for their records.

Dallas Van Lear ended the meeting by thanking us for coming. Mike prayed and the meeting ended at 7:44pm.

### **Confirmation Class at New Hope UMC Coming September 2022**



### **Be Confirmed in your Faith**

Confirmation is a program for students in grades 6 -12 who wish to be confirmed in the United Methodist Church. The program is designed to study the beliefs of the United Methodist Church as well as to dive deep into what it means to be a Christian. Upon completion, students will have the opportunity to stand before the congregation and proclaim their faith and their commitment to New Hope UMC.

### What does Confirmation look like?

At New Hope UMC, confirmands will meet once a week from September through November for 8 weeks. We will meet on Sunday mornings during Sunday School. The class is taught by Pastor Mike to help the students understand and grasp the key elements of their faith as Christians, as well as basic United Methodist theology.

### When is Confirmation?

Confirmation will begin on Sunday, September 11, 2022, with a meeting of all confirmation students and their families after worship. Our first class will be held on Sunday, September 18th during the Sunday School hour. Confirmation Sunday will be November 20th, 2022.

### What is Confirmation?

Although confirmation is not a sacrament in The United Methodist Church, it is an important marker along our spiritual journeys. At baptism, we are initiated into the new covenant in Jesus Christ and membership in the Church, Christ's body in the world. For many, this happens when they are very young.

We recognize children are members of their families, but no one expects them to clean their rooms or empty the dishwasher until much later. In the same way, "baptized infants are members of the Church—the family of faith—but are not yet capable of sharing everything involved in membership."

Confirmation is an opportunity to respond to the grace of God available to us, as acknowledged in baptism, and to promise to live as a person of faith. "What God offers us must be accepted in repentance and faith...confirmation and reaffirmation are our responses of commitment, a profession of faith, and rededication."

### It's Not Too Late To Register!

Parents should encourage their children to register for Confirmation Class. Registration forms will be available at the information table in the Narthex.

### **Do You Love The Lord your God?**

"One of the scribes approached. When he heard them debating and saw that Jesus answered them well, he asked him, "Which command is the most important of all?" Jesus answered, "The most important is Listen, Israel! The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is, Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other command greater than these." Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, teacher. You have correctly said that he is one, and there is no one else except him. And to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, and with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself, is far more important than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices." When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to question him any longer." Mark 12:28-34 CSB

This thought has been on my heart for quite a while now. In my personal bible studies, the more that I read, learn and feed my soul, I have asked myself this question. How much do I really love the Lord? I have repented of my sins, I've been baptized, I have the Holy Spirit, based on what the word says about the fruits of the Spirit. But how do people know that I love the Lord my God? I have genuinely questioned myself on this. Am I serious about our God and the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ? I've recently been reading more in the Old Testament and I have a couple study tools that show connecting verses between the old and New Testament. After reading about how much God wants his people to love him, I have felt convicted. In this newsletter, I will share that conviction with you.

I encourage you to read Deuteronomy chapter 6. Not only does the Lord want us to love him and keep his commandments, but he wants us to teach our children and grandchildren. Even wanting his people to recite his words when we go to bed and when we get up in the morning. Jesus tells us in John 14 that if we love him we will keep his commandments and later to keep his word. He says another place in John that his words are what will judge us on judgment day. There are way too many scripture references to put into this newsletter. The overall point that I want to give here is to encourage all who read this now and later to rekindle the love in your heart for our Lord. In reading the 10 Commandments and more I've read the love and care that God has for us. Those and the moral law that he gives us are for our good. They are for our personal prosperity. They are for our safety. For our rest and for our well-being. He wants so badly to take care of and provide for us.

But he is also God, he is not a sweet old grandpa who gets taken advantage of by a family who doesn't care about him. Everything about him is righteous therefore when there is evil in this world or in us it is his responsibility to take care of it. If not then he is not just, and in actuality if he wants to let us do whatever we want, he really doesn't love us. Jesus Christ did not come and die for us so that we can continue in our sins and do damage to our soul and body. The Old and New Testaments are nothing but a story of God's eternal love, and the means and ways that he provides to love us and for us to love him. Because there is no evil in him and because he is the Almighty righteous one and only God, he also works justice. Jesus Christ came so that we would have grace for our sins. To continue sinning so that grace continues is disgraceful.

God wants us to walk in his righteousness. As Jesus said in the passage above the greatest commandment is that we would love the Lord our God with all of our heart, with all of our soul, and with all of our strength. The next is that we would love our neighbor as ourselves. And that truly is the summary of what God wants for us. And when we continue to go against those two things the only thing that prospers is sin, pain, hate, everything that is evil. I've never seen a time in our society where there is so much division, adversity, hate, and so much mean behavior in people. All of that is an abomination to the Lord our God. It is not what he wants. I know that none of us are perfect, and we all do sin no matter how hard we try not to. We are saved by grace through faith in Christ alone. But by walking in his righteousness we show that we are saved. We keep the law of Christ. May we uphold his word. As a personal idea, maybe we should wake up each day imagining that Jesus was just crucified yesterday and it was because of what we did that day.

The world is in desperate need of real believers and God. The world needs people who desperately love the Lord their God with everything that they have. Those who love their neighbors as themselves. I know it's impossible for everyone on this planet to do that. I do believe if those of us who claim to be Christians do it first, we could bring some positive change. God bless you all and may at the end of every day you be found in Christ.



# Kids' Corner - Jonah and the Big Fish

One day God asked a man named Jonah to go to a place called Nineveh and tell the people living there to stop being bad. The only problem was that Jonah didn't want to help the people there. He knew they were bad and he wanted them to be punished for their mistakes.

So instead of listening to God, Jonah thought he would run away from Nineveh and not do what God asked him. He ran to the sea where he found a ship that was going to another city. He paid the captain, went in the lower part of the boat and went to sleep.

Shortly after the boat left the shore, a very bad storm came up and started tossing the boat around. All the men were very afraid so they started to throw all their packages and bags overboard in hopes that they wouldn't drown.

The captain soon went

to find Jonah who was still sound asleep in the boat. He said to Jonah, "How can you sleep? Get up and pray to your god, maybe he can help us!" The captain didn't realize that Jonah didn't just believe in any God but the one true God and that He could help them.
