Administrative Council Meeting Minutes - October 24, 2024

Meeting called to order by Becky Breeding, prayer concerns noted. Cindy Deavers led devotions.

No additions or corrections to the September council meeting minutes all approved as presented.

1. Finance Committee - Bruce Rogers:

- Giving for three Sundays in October have been average
- \$1440.60 have been collected in donations to go to UMCOR to support hurricane Helene relief efforts. These donations are a combination of personal giving and mission fundraisers.
- Reports for charge conference which is to be held on November 3rd have been completed and filed with the district. Many thanks to Becky Breeding for making sure this information was supplied and deadline was met

2. Treasurers report- Cindy Deavers

- Explained money designated for UMCOR \$915.91 noted on balance sheet
- Apportionments accepted have been paid
- Gift and Memorial Fund received money from the 50s drive in fundraiser
- Gifts have been received in memory of Joanie Schofield, UMW Circle Love/Hope to donate \$100 earmarked for kitchen supplies
- New stoves have been paid in full -\$3027.00 for the set. ½ of the cost paid by UMM, the other ½ paid by the UMW plus some additional gift donations. There may be extra charges for installation.
- 3. Financial secretary-Becky Breeding Nothing to report

4. SPRC- Sandy Wyrick -

- Money in budget for full-time accompanist will be moved/used to pay our part time pianist so as not to rely on Community Dinner or other funds to pay for the same.
- Agreement has been reached with a new custodial service; they will work as 1099 / self-contractors. To begin January 1, 2025

5. Trustees – Corey Johnson

- Old propane tanks to be removed from property on/about 10/25/24
- An AV company has been contracted to troubleshoot the AV system on 10/31/24 regarding the continuing camera problem, all Corey's attempts to resolve the issue had been unsuccessful.
- Carpet in the Narthex was cleaned

- District Conference report: Thanks to all who helped compiling the report needed for the District Charge Conference, all was completed and filed before the deadline.
- Community Meal of 10/23/24 had great attendance, we served between 65 70 people from our community. Free will donation of \$230 was obtained, thank you to all who participated in every capacity. Next community dinner will be December 18, 2024 at 5:30pm

7. Lay Leader, UMM – Bill Lalla:

- Church attendance month of October is rounding out at about 46 per week thus far
- UMM Workday 10/26/24 To pick up sticks, straighten out the parking block in parking area, clean up work in the cemetery.

8. Membership Secretary – Karen Whitmer:

- Summary for the year as far as membership: Lost 4 members due to their passing. Lost 14 members due to transfer/withdrawal.
- 9. **Communications –** AV Camera situation is still being reviewed.

10. Program/Event Planning Update:

- Evaluated the 50's Drive In noted it was better than expected due to lack of staffing.
 Issues to improve on, pre-prep in service line, 2 extra kitchen workers, and 1 2 more runners for the takeout orders. Collect flat boxes instead of bags. Music outside, maybe.

- Good participation at Endless View Farms for the bazaar, raised over \$700 for UMCOR buckets that day.
- District conference to be held 11/3/24 Bridgewater UMC, 3pm
- Community Thanksgiving service will be at Laurel Hill Baptist Sunday 11/24/24 at 7pm.
- Leverne Herring will be heading up the Apple Tree Project as Christmas mission for us this year, details to come
- Agreed we should participate in the New Hope Christmas parade this year, Dec No float, we will just walk to and from, dress warm and be sure you can walk the distance. Susan Mehler agreed to have hot cocoa and cookies available for the "line Up" before the parade begins.
- November 7th 6:30 Planning Meeting for anyone who wants to/needs to put an activity on the 2025 calendar. We would like to put down as much as possible, so we don't have too much going on at one time.
