After spending the last ten months examining the current state of the United Methodist Church and discerning its future path, New Hope United Methodist Church has a Called Church Conference (CCC) scheduled for Tuesday. August 29, 2023, at 7:30 p.m.

Please take time to read the official notice which is included in The Hilltopper for more details about the CCC.

This vote will determine the future direction of New Hope Church. All professing members present at the CCC are eligible to vote. Please attend the Thursday, August 3 Council meeting if you need more information about the CCC and its implications.

The February 19, 2023, straw poll indicated that this church was not of one mind on disaffiliation (55% disaffiliate / 45% remain UMC). The vote at the CCC will settle the matter of whether to disaffiliate from the UMC. A majority vote of 66.67% or more of those professing members in attendance at the CCC is required for the vote to pass.

I lament the fact that we are in this place. However, our church leadership believes an official vote is necessary for the church to move forward one way or another.

And here we are.

## **Announcement of a Called Church Conference**

Over the last several months, our church family has engaged in an intentional and prayerful discernment regarding our continued affiliation with The United Methodist Church. The results of that discernment have led us to work with the District Superintendent and Conference Trustees to facilitate our church's disaffiliation from The United Methodist Church. The next step in that process is a vote of the Professing Members of our church regarding the Disaffiliation Agreement that would facilitate the separation of our church from The United Methodist Church. The key terms of the Disaffiliation Agreement will be presented at the Called Church Conference prior to the vote.

There will be a Called Church Conference of the New Hope United Methodist Church on Tuesday, August 29, 2023, at 7:30 p.m. in the church (55 Round Hill School Road, Fort Defiance, VA). The purpose of this Called Church Conference is to vote on the Disaffiliation Agreement between our church and the Virginia Conference Trustees and to affirm our desire to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Denomination. All are welcome to attend, but only Professing Members of New Hope United Methodist Church who are present at this meeting are eligible to vote. The meeting will be presided over by District Superintendent Rev. Victor Gomez.

Following a 2/3 affirmative vote, New Hope United Methodist Church will deliver the Disaffiliation Agreement, signed by the church's Trustees, to the Conference Trustees along with a small deposit. The Disaffiliation Agreement then will need to be approved and ratified by the Annual Conference at a session to be held virtually on Saturday, October 7, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. at which time the Disaffiliation Agreement will become binding. After ratification, and once all legal details have been completed in accordance with the terms of the Disaffiliation Agreement, the disaffiliation will become effective. At this time, a consensus has not been reached on whether to affiliate with the Global Methodist Church, Free Methodist, or become Independent.



Due to the Vacation Bible School schedule, our July Church Council meeting was rescheduled to August 3, 2023. The minutes of this meeting will be available in the September Hilltopper.

You hear comments in Bible classes that amount to what's wrong with the church, what we're doing wrong, what we're not doing, and what it's doing to us, our children, and the world. You read people's minds through their social media rants, raves, and ramblings, and the bottom line message is that the church is inept, irrelevant, irresponsible, or, worse, insidious. To hear some tell it, the church is not only unhelpful, but actually hurtful. I know that we can be prone to say things out of hurt, disappointment, anger, and bitterness, but the words themselves are no less potent even if influenced by such emotions.

Is the contention, as one Christian sister put it, that "the church is broken," true? Another way to put that is, "Are elders, preachers, deacons, Bible class teachers, and every other Christian broken?" Perhaps we impersonalize it and overly-institutionalize it with a nameless, faceless designation of "church." But the church is, as we were taught as children, "the people." People who are prone to say the right thing at the wrong time, the wrong thing at the right time, and, sadly, the wrong thing at the wrong time. We disappoint, we mishandle, we poorly execute, we unfairly judge and criticize, and we simply blow it. That is definitely not an excuse or a permission slip for bad behavior. Yet, it is not likely to ever change.

Because the church is made up of sinners saved by grace, the church is broken. We who are quick to condemn the church as broken need to face that we ourselves, as those placed by Christ into that church when we were saved, are broken, too. Show me the perfect person who never mishandles a situation, never sins with tongue, attitude, or deed, and I'll show you someone who will stand before Christ at the Judgment saved on the basis of their own merit and goodness. That won't happen.

Let's be reminded of what the church is. It is the precious, beloved bride of Christ (Eph. 5:22-25; Rev. 19:7; 21:2). It is that institution purchased by His very life's blood (Acts 20:28). It is that which was thought up by God from eternity before time as is the expression of His manifold wisdom (Eph. 3:9-11). It is the place where Christ is glorified (Eph. 3:21; 5:27). It is the present the Son will present to His Father when time is no more (1 Cor. 15:24). It is that and truly so much more.

God designed the church. Reckless criticism of it, is reckless criticism of Him. All of us should be determined to improve in every area of our spiritual lives, to be for others what we need to be, to conquer faults and sins in our lives. We should also extend to others the grace we intensely desire to receive when we stand before the King on the last day!

Yes, the church is broken, but not in the sense that it cannot help, serve, minister, love, and encourage. Let each of us strive to be the church we want the church to be. Model and exemplify it. Emit the fragrance of Christ. That way, the broken church can help mend the broken lives that make it up.




