From Pastor Mike

Psalm 23 is, perhaps, the best-known passage in the Bible. When I visit someone with dementia and recite this scripture, the person will recall the Psalm and say it with me. It is embedded in the memory of so many and has brought comfort in times of grief, loss, and disappointment.

According to tradition, Psalm 23 is attributed to King David. David certainly knew about shepherding! This beautiful, poetic psalm speaks to the very heart of our relationship with God. It is a reminder of His loving care and guidance in our lives.

"The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing."

This first line sets the tone for the rest of the psalm. The image of God as our shepherd is one that is both comforting and reassuring. We can trust Him to lead us and provide for us. When we have God as our shepherd, we lack nothing.

"He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul."

God cares for us in every way, providing for our physical and spiritual needs. Just as a shepherd would lead his sheep to green pastures and quiet waters, God leads us to places of rest and refreshment. When we are tired and weary, He restores our souls.

"He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake."

God is not just concerned with our individual well-being, but also with His reputation. As we follow Him, He guides us along the right paths for His name's sake. His guidance is not just for our own benefit, but for the sake of His kingdom.

"Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me."

This verse acknowledges that there will be difficult times in our lives. We will walk through dark valleys and face evil. But even in those moments, we can find comfort in the presence of God. His rod and staff, the symbol of His protection and guidance, bring comfort and peace.

"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows."

God not only cares for our needs, but He also blesses us abundantly. He prepares a feast for us in the presence of our enemies, showing that even during conflict, we can still experience His goodness. He anoints us with oil, a sign of His blessing, and our cup overflows with His goodness.

"Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

The psalm concludes with a powerful statement of faith. We can trust that God's goodness and love will follow us all the days of our lives. And we can look forward to dwelling in the house of the Lord forever. As we walk through life with God as our shepherd, we can rest assured that He will lead us home.

Psalm 23 is a beautiful reminder of God's loving care for us. As we go through life, we can trust in His guidance and provision, even in the darkest of times. And we can look forward to the day when we will dwell in His presence forever.

Church Council Meeting Minutes - April 27, 2023

Present: Kevin Armstrong, Teresa Barr, Becky Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Robin Craun, Cindy Deavers, Phyllis Fretwell, Wanda Harding, Beth Howdyshell, Linda Howdyshell, Bill Lalla, Kim Maugans, Pastor Mike, Cindy Sheets, Dallas VanLear, Pam VanLear and Karen Whitmer.

The meeting was called to order by chairperson Dallas Van Lear. And Dallas read a devotion from God's Amazing Grace (2 Kings 18:1 and Romans 8:15), and prayed.

The minutes to the March 2023 meeting were approved and accepted as distributed.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong reported)

- The audits are complete.
- Will have a budget meeting in August.
- Last month was a good month, financially speaking, mainly because of Easter Sunday. We took in \$13,000.
- Kevin suggested that we pay \$2,000 more on the Active Clergy Health

Treasurer: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- There was a donation given and an additional \$500 was given to Travis Painter, our groundskeeper, for maintaining the cemetery.
- We paid \$550 to Tim Woodsen for stripping and polishing our floors in the social hall, the hallway, the kitchen and the storage room (off of the social hall).

Trustees: (Pastor Mike reported)

- Will meet on May 11th (on every second Thursday of the month) for the next meeting.
- Effective as of April 8th, 2023 Mitch Brensinger stepped down as Trustees Chairperson. There is a nomination for Jack Walker to fill this position, but the Trustees will need to approve it first.

Pastor Mike: (Pastor Mike reported)

- Mike is looking to have a presentation about his trip to Cuba.
- There will be a Nominations Committee Meeting
- Effective March 26th, 2023 Jennifer Strother stepped down as our Lay Leader. So we will need a new Lay Leader and also a Lay Member to Annual Conference. Bill Lalla has agreed to take over this position, but we still need a permanent Lay Leader.
- Kevin made a motion for Jack Walker to take over as Trustees Chair and Bill Lalla to take over as Lay Member to Annual Conference. Kim M. seconded it and it was passed by all.

Worship: (Pastor Mike reported)

- For this committee, we are still in need of a chairperson, a lay leader, a person for altar care and a communion steward. If you would be interested in more information about these positions and this committee, please see Pastor Mike.
- This committee will meet quarterly.
- The Hospitality Team: There have been updates and changes made to this committee's policy.
- Bill made a motion to accept the new hospitality policy, Kevin seconded it and it was passed by all.
- Karen Whitmer has stepped down as chairperson of this committee. If you are interested in taking this position, please see Pastor Mike.

Evangelism: (Pastor Mike reported)

- For May, they will be collecting sunscreen and canned vegetables

- On Thursday, April 20th, the UMM met with 10 members present. They had a presentation from the Valley Program for Aging Services (VPAS)
- The UMM served 34 on Easter Sunday breakfast.
- The April spring clean-up was canceled due to bad weather
- Bruce Rogers and Darrell Deavers, along with a few other men have been helping do yard work for some people around the community.
- On Saturday, May 20th there will be a Spaghetti Supper Fundraiser, and they will take up a free-will offering to help support the New Hope Youth Association, the New Hope Ruritans, and the New Hope Fire Department.

- If we continue down this path to take a vote to stay or leave the conference, we will have to send written notification to approximately 250 people who may be eligible to vote. We will need people to handle the mailing and we will have to pay for the materials and postage. (The District Superintendent will provide us with the letter to send out.)
- Regardless of the decision made, Karen is still working to purge the membership roll.
- Please keep in mind that all of these are work in progress.

Unfinished Business:

 Robin Craun announced that she will be stepping down as Finance Secretary by the end of this year. She is willing to help us until we get a replacement and will be willing to help train the next person who takes over this role. Disaffiliation Business:

- Dallas has taken the lead in working to get an attorney for this process.
- We will need a new liaison between the church and the District Superintendent now that Jennifer has stepped down. No one at the church council meeting volunteered to take on the position, so Dallas will work on trying to get someone to fill that role.

New Business:

- In the next 6 months, we will have 3 new babies in our church. We are wanting to re-establish the nursery with new furniture, etc.
- It was suggested that we have a 'Baby Shower' for the nursery, wherein people could donate new items to the nursery.
- Cindy S. said that we have \$250 in the budget for the nursery. And we have money in the non-designated fund as well, that we could potentially use.
- It was stated that we need to put together a list of needed things before we could proceed further at this time.

Dallas Van Lear ended the meeting stating his appreciation for everyone coming to the meeting and for helping move the church forward, and thanked Pastor Mike for his hard work in keeping everything together. Pastor Mike prayed and the meeting ended at 7:26pm.

PROGRAM: The program featured Janice Gentry, Director of Senior Services for Valley Program for Aging Services (VPAS) which serves Staunton/Augusta/Waynesboro. The agency provides a variety of free services targeted to help local residents 60 and older. Funding is provided by local, state and federal programs. 


