From Pastor Mike

They say hindsight is 20/20 which means it is easier to analyze and evaluate situations when we are looking back on them in the past, than when we are in the present moment. The word "hindsight" refers to looking back or reflecting on things in the past and "20/20" refers to perfect vision.

By the time you read this the year 2020 will be in our rearview mirror – it will be hindsight. However, I doubt enough time has passed for us to fully process and appreciate the past year as we look ahead to 2021. As people of faith, we can say that despite the disappointments, the frustrations, and all these things we lost in the past year, God has been and will continue to be with us.

Perhaps now we need to look forward at where we are headed. John 10:27 says, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me." We need to begin to listen and make the decisions that conform to the will of God. Listening to His voice is the foresight we need. In Jeremiah 29, the Lord said, "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end." We will know where we are going when we listen and obey God's voice which is the work of the Holy Spirit.

Simple to say but not always easy to put into practice.

While God can come to us at any time and any place, it is often helpful to prepare our hearts to be receptive to the Holy Spirit stirring within us. Throughout his ministry, John Wesley taught about the means of grace – things we do regularly to put ourselves in a place where we are open to receiving the grace of God. Those practices include individual and communal works of piety and works of mercy, like private devotions, sharing in the sacraments, visiting the sick, and standing up for justice. We cannot control when or where God will speak to us – it often seems to happen unexpectedly – but we can put ourselves in a place where we will be ready to hear when it happens.

This is important. Our focus as Christians is to work on ourselves – to strengthen our own relationship with God. We need to avoid the drama of getting drawn into every argument about politics, theology, the pandemic, etc. The past year was full of drama and many times we have been quick to dive right into it. There is a better way.

The Rev. Shane Bishop is the Senior Pastor at Christ United Methodist Church in Fairview Heights, IL. I recommend his book, "Love God, Love People, Don't Do Dumb Crap" (2017). Bishop recently wrote a Facebook post suggesting we need to cut down on drama in 2021. He offers these 5 drama-reducing suggestions.

- 1) Offer people the benefit of the doubt.
- 2) Be quick to apologize when you get cross threaded.
- 3) Do not put energy into things you cannot change.
- 4) Focus on improving yourself; not improving others.
- 5) Lean into healthy habits.

I am not much on New Years' resolutions but striving for less drama in 2021 might be worth considering. Let us embrace the Golden Rule and treat others as we wish to be treated. You want to be respected? Show respect. You want to be heard? Listen to others. This is foundational and seems like a reasonable place to begin because it involves us changing our own attitudes and behaviors.

Wherever the new year takes us, remember we travel the road together knowing that God is with us and goes on ahead of us.


Minutes from the meeting on November 19, 2020

- UMM supported Trunk or Treat for the children of New Hope UMC and the local community. A total of 75 bags of goodies were given out during the Drive Thru Event.
- At the September meeting Dallas expressed his desire to step down as President of UMM. He created a
 Nominating Committee (Mitch Brensinger/Corey Johnson/Bruce Rogers Chmn) to develop
 recommendations for a slate of Officers to serve a two year term beginning in 2021. The Committee
 presented the following list of candidates for consideration: President Kim Maugans, Vice-President –
 Corey Johnson, Treasurer Kenny Fretwell, Secretary Bruce Rogers. A motion (Bruce Rogers/Dallas
 VanLeer) was made to accept the recommendations of the Committee. The motion was approved. The
 new officers will begin on January 1, 2021.
- REMINDER Until further notice, UMM will meet at 6:30 pm on the Third Thursday of every other month. The next meeting is at 6:30 pm on Thursday, January 21, 2021.
- All meetings are conducted following COVID 19 Guidelines for wearing masks, social distancing, limited numbers and responsible actions.

NEW BUSINESS:

- UMM has agreed to purchase the hams needed to make ham sandwiches to be sold as a fund raiser. The
 sale will be conducted by the UMW with support from others in the church. All monies received will be
 donated to the Verona Community Food Pantry. (A total of \$1,000 was collected and donated to the
 VCFP.)
- The new officers were congratulated and welcomed to their new positions.
- Dallas VanLeer was thanked for his leadership and dedication to the UMM during a very difficult year, 2020. He has continued to keep UMM together and focused on our goal to assist others through Christian Love and Fellowship.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned after a prayer by Pastor Mike.

Church Council Meeting Minutes - December 3, 2020

Present: Pastor Mike, Dallas VanLear, Cindy Sheets, Kevin Armstrong, Karen Whitmer, Wanda Harding, Jennifer Strother, Larry & Nadine Hinebaugh, Cindy Deavers and Robin Craun.

The meeting was called to order by chairman Dallas VanLear, with devotions and prayer.

The minutes from the October meeting were accepted as distributed.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong)

- ~ We are 92.3% of the way through the year. We are at a 72% in-take for the year (\$136,000). We have spent 75% of the budget this year so far (\$144,000).
- ~ We have a 1 month reprieve for paying the apportionments to the district, because they received money from the Paycheck Protection Program. With that said, we currently still owe the district \$1,685 in apportionments for the year.
- ~ We are holding at having a 3-4 month operating cost.
- ~ Kevin made a motion to bring the district apportionments up to date and pay them \$1,685; and also pay 2 months of apportionments to the conference which is \$3,638. Dallas seconded it and it was passed by all.
- ~ It was also agreed that we pay the Verona Food Pantry \$500, that we have budgeted, by the end of the end.
- ~ It was reported that \$1,200 was raised from the Ham Roll Fundraiser and that money will also go to the Verona Food Pantry via the United Methodist Men.

Treasurer's Report: (Cindy Deavers)

- ~ The apportionments agreed upon in the last meeting have been paid. And all giving was caught up for November.
- ~ For the Weekday Religious Education Program: There was a mistake made and 2 checks were sent out to this program for \$2,500 each, instead of just one. It was agreed upon that we will just contact the WRE Program and explain to them that one check will be our donation for the year of 2020; and the second check will be our donation for the year 2021.

<u>Trustees Report</u>: (Larry Hinebaugh)

~ The new church sign will be installed soon. The total cost will be \$350. Additional costs will be paid for by an anonymous person.

Pastor's Report: (Pastor Mike)

- ~ Our Bible Study ended and averaged 13 people each week. The Advent Bible Study currently is averaging 7 people.
- ~ Pastor Mike upgraded the Comcast internet service; which will give us 3 times the speed and power than we currently have from 10 upload speeds to 30. The cost is about \$58 more each month, and Pastor Mike will pay for the difference. Also the initial installation was \$100.
- ~ The Commonwealth Attorney's Restitution hearing for the destruction of the church sign will be on December 15th. We will have no say in how much we can ask for, the judge will decide if money restitution is appropriate and if so, the judge will also decide how much to charge.
- ~ In-Person Worship: Some churches have stopped in-person worship services. We are clear through Christmas to continue how we have been operating. After Christmas, things may change based how our number of cases of Covid-19 in our area; and based on what the Governor and the Bishop decide.
- ~ Christmas Eve Service: Two-four churches in our area want to come together to do a pre-recorded Christmas Eve Service. Details will be worked out with the appropriate people.
 - Poinsettias: There will be 8 small and 3 large poinsettias for decorations in the church. They will be available to purchase after December 20th.

United Methodist Men Report: (Dallas VanLear)

- ~ The UMM agreed to pay for the ham that was used for the Ham Roll Fundraiser.
- ~ The UMM elected new officers: Kim Maugans will be the new UMM President
- ~ They will be meeting again on the third Thursday in January, no meal will be served.

United Methodist Women Report: (Wanda Harding)

- ~ The UMW collected \$1,011 for the Verona Food Pantry
- ~ Circle of Hope meets at 7:00pm on Monday in the social hall.
- ~ Circle of Love meets at 7:00pm on Tuesday
- ~ Emma's Ride Project: Is there a car dealer or a non-profit that might want to try to help us with this project?
 - There will be more snowman ornaments made for donations to Emma's Ride available by December 12th. See Jennifer Strother if interested or come by the church to get them.

Staff/Parish Relations Report: (Pastor Mike)

~ Will meet again within the next month. There needs to be a decision made by January 15th as to whether we want Pastor Mike to stay for another term.

Membership Report: (Karen Whitmer)

~ We 'lost our sister' Mary Sheets on November 15th.

<u>Lay Leader Report</u>: (Jennifer Strother)

~ There were limited classes given on Lay Leadership last month and there will be more in the future; either virtually or in-person with social-distancing, that's to be determined.

Communications Report: (Cindy Sheets)

~ We have given FaceBook ample time and it doesn't seem as though that they will be reinstating our

church's page; so we will work to get a new one up and running so that we can all stay in contact.

Unfinished Business:

~ Robin reported that she will have new tithing envelopes ready and in the Narthex by the end of the

year. If everyone could come pick their envelopes up or make arrangements for someone to get the

envelopes to them. If the envelopes are not picked up, we will have to pay to mail them and that could

get costly.

- Also, Robin reported that all tax statements will be sent out by the end of January 2021; so if

you have not received yours yet, please be patient.

~ Dallas thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and for all of their work behind the scenes.

~ Pastor Mike and the whole committee thanked Dallas for his leadership this year.


Pastor Mike closed us with prayer and the meeting ended at: 7:23pm.


