The minutes are available to help the entire church family stay in the know about how this group is caring for New Hope UMC!

Church Council Meeting Minutes - November 30, 2023

<u>Present:</u> Kevin Armstrong, Becky Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Cindy Deavers, Wanda Harding, Linda Howdyshell, Corey Johnson, Bill Lalla, Pastor Mike, Bruce Rogers, Cindy Sheets, Karen Whitmer and chairperson Dallas VanLear

The meeting was called to order by chairperson Dallas Van Lear, and Cindy Sheets read a devotional from the Upper Room and prayed.

The minutes to the October meeting were passed by all as presented.

Finance Report: (Kevin Armstrong reported)

- Our budget for 2024 will be changing slightly because of a \$876 drop in apportionments. Kevin made a motion to make the change to this 2024 budget, Dallas seconded it and it was passed by all.
- Giving for the month was around \$10,000.
- For the end of the year donations: Kevin made a motion to make donations in the following amounts: \$120 to the District Board of Missions, \$500 to the Verona Food Pantry, \$500 to the Valley Mission, and \$2,500 to the WRE Weekday Religious Education.
- The Finance Committee is in part responsible to help raise money to pay the bills, etc. The committee will meet in January to discuss creative ways to do this with other committee chairpersons.

Treasurer: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- Cindy Deavers explained the information, what is included and how to correctly read the monthly treasurer's report for the committee members.
- After the committee was made aware that we have a number of small funds sitting under utilized Becky made a motion to take the money from the Korea Trip Fund (\$150), the Missions Fund (\$100), the Ethel White Mouse Ministry Fund (\$50) and the 50's Drive-In Fund (\$1,293) totaling \$1,593 to go back into the General Fund and to be used for the end of year donations that Kevin discussed early. We will also speak with Jennifer Strother about how best to handle the money that we are currently holding in the Jennifer Strother Seminary Fund (\$668). Kevin seconded the motion and it was passed by all.
- Cindy Deavers also pointed out that we have \$7,932.15 in non-designated funds still available for us to use as the committee deems necessary.
- There are also additional funds that were discussed and made a motion on.... The Eutsler Education Fund (\$1,152.92); the Local Missions Fund (\$345.37); and the Organ Fund (\$239.78). And Pastor Mike said that we could comfortably move \$2,000 out of the Minister Moving Expenses Fund. Becky made a motion to move all of these funds including \$2,500 out of the Minster Moving Expenses Fund into the General Fund to be used as the committee deems necessary. Corey seconded the motion and it was passed by all.
- The bills and payroll have been paid for November.
- A \$1,000 donation was received for the Minister's Discretionary Fund.
- Anyone who wants Cindy Deavers to go over the Treasurer's Report, she is happy to meet with them anytime to do that.

Finance Secretary: (Becky Breeding reported)

- 2024 Offering Envelopes are out in the Narthex. If you don't see your name, please ask Becky Breeding.

Trustees: (Corey Johnson reported)

- We have not had any damage due to the current cold streak.
- Corey said that the cemetery plots we have now are well below the national average, so he made a motion to raise the cemetery plots to \$1,000 for members and \$1,500 for non-members; effective January 1, 2024.

Pastor Mike: (Pastor Mike reported)

- The driveway easement on the parking lot across the street from the church will be getting gravel, and this is being paid by the owners of the home across the street.
- We had three members attend the Charge Conference on November 12th.
- We have 11 people participating in the Advent Bible Study.
- Since the last church council meeting, \$1,275 has been added to the Discretionary Fund.
- We will have only one service on Christmas Eve morning; due to staff concerns and other factors.
- The Sanctuary will be getting decorated on Saturday, December 2nd at 11am. The Chrismon Tree should be up by then. A pizza party will follow the decorating.
- Nominations: Becky Breeding will be our new Church Council Chairperson starting in January. And Bill Lalla will be our new Lay Leader in January. There are still a number of open positions. Pastor Mike made a motion to receive the Nominations Report, Dallas seconded it, and it was passed by all.

UM Men: (Bill Lalla reported)

- Darryl has a neighbor who may need some help that the UMM could help that person with, and that would generate some money for the UMM.
- The UMM are looking to see if they can work to get the tree in front of the Sanctuary cut down themselves without having to pay a third party.
- The UMM donated \$1,000 to the Minister's Discretionary Fund.

UM Women: (Wanda Harding reported)

- The Circle of Hope and the Circle of Love will meet jointly on Monday, December 4th at 6:30pm.
- The Sisters of Faith will meet on Monday, December 4th for lunch.
- The Kingsway Prison Ministry has a mission opportunity. They are needing 6 oz tubes of toothpaste. Please bring them to the church and LeVerene will deliver those items.

Staff Parish Relations:

- They will have an end of the year meeting on Wednesday, December 20th.

Membership: (Karen Whitmer reported)

- Luella Jean Walker was born on Friday, November 24th, 2023. Her parents are Josh and Sarah Walker, and her grandparents are Jack and Joetta Walker.
- So far this year, there have been: 2 births, 4 deaths and 2 members transferred into our church.

Youth: (Cindy Sheets reported)

- \$2,331 was deposited into the Youth account after the 50's Drive-In. Of that amount \$1,810 was profit from the event. Currently there is \$2,552.09 in the Youth account.
- There is also a need for someone else to be added to this Youth bank account, if anyone is interested please see Cindy Sheets or Pastor Mike.
- Dallas thanked everyone and was appreciative for their leadership during his time as church council chair. And we all thanked him for his dedication and service during these difficult past few years.

Pastor Mike prayed and the meeting ended at 7:43pm

NEW BUSINESS: The need for additional money in the Pastor's Discretionary Fund was discussed. A motion (BillLalla/Jack Walker) was made and approved to donate \$1,000 to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. There is a bench in the rear of the Sanctuary that needs repair. UMM will work to get it repaired. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned after a prayer by Pastor Mike. There was no way for her to know how cruddy my morning had been going, but she just looked at me with such bright-smiling eyes ... and I saw Jesus!


Such a wonderful blessing! Anytime you can see God in someone.
